Spotlight on: Flat Rock Farm

Just last month, <u>Flat Rock Farm</u> in Chesterfield worked with Eversource and the Massachusetts Farm Energy Program to upgrade the outdoor watering system for their cattle. Both Eversource and MFEP helped fund the install of an energy efficient waterer (pictured above), which ensures clean drinking water for the cattle throughout the winter and saves 5,164 kWh of electricity and over \$800 per year.

In addition, Flat Rock has inspired two neighboring farms to install energy efficient waterers for their animals. These three projects together will save over 36,000 kWh of electricity and \$5,700 per year!
