Spotlight On: Justamere Tree Farm



Newly constructed zero net energy maple kitchen at Justamere Tree Farm in Worthington

<u>Justamere Tree Farm</u> in Worthington recently completed construction on their zero net energy maple kitchen, which includes a solar array and energy efficient heating system. This kitchen has helped the farm expand their operation, and produce their value-added maple products more efficiently. With help from MFEP staff, the farm applied for and was awarded \$40,000 from the MDAR Special Projects Program to help cover the cost of this project.

The Special Projects Program is a part of the MDAR Agricultural Energy Grant that funds specific, higher capital cost, energy saving and energy replacement opportunities that improve energy efficiency and facilitate alternative clean energy needs. The project categories can change from year to year, but this year's still include zero net energy construction, as well as dual use of land solar photovoltaic arrays and heat recovery for anaerobic digesters.
